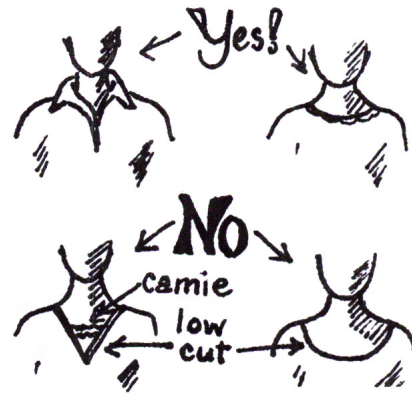

Highlights From The Handbook For Classroom Dress Code

DRESS CODE FOR GIRLS:

Girls must wear dresses or skirts and blouses

- Shirts must be long enough to be tucked in and must have sleeves one of the approved necklines (see illustration). Do not wear sleeveless clothing to school even with a sweater or jacket.
- A dress does not have to have a collar, but must be high-necked (see illustration to the right), must not be tight fitting, and must have sleeves. Tight-fitting Lycra or spandex skirts or dresses are not allowed.
- Girls' tops must be opaque and not be made of clinging material. Girls must always wear a blouse or turtleneck under a sweater. Blouses and shirts may have no more than one button unbuttoned at the neck, even if another top is worn under the shirt.
- Girls' dresses/skirts must be below the kneecap in the front of the leg and must cover the crease in the back of the leg so that the knees are covered when walking or sitting and must be loose-fitting. Dresses/skirts must not be short, tight, clingy, or form fitting.
- Slits or gaps in dresses/skirts are not permitted. Dresses/skirts which are made with any gap must be sewn – not pinned – closed or have material sewn in to make a pleat rather than a slit/gap. Wrap-around dresses/skirts are not permitted. Button-down skirts must button to below the knee.
- The following is unacceptable: wide or low necklines that are more than two inches below the collar bone (about the width of three fingers) and expose more than a crewneck T-shirt, tight clothing, exposed underclothing, bare midriffs, or crop tops. Camis to raise necklines are no longer acceptable. Scarves to cover low or wide necklines are not acceptable.
- Shoes must be dress shoes. Heels must not be more than 2 inches measured from the back and must have closed toes and heels. Socks, stockings or tights must be worn.



DRESS CODE FOR BOYS:

Boys must have dress slacks, dress shirt, tie and uniform shoes

- Boys may also wear a sweater and/or a jacket.
- Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- Collar buttons must be buttoned.
- Pants must not be oversized. No cargo pants.
- Belts must be worn with clothing that has belt loops.
- The waistline of pants must be at— not below—the student's waistline.
- Ties must be tied at the neck.
- Shoes must be uniform dress shoes.
- Boys' hair may not be more than four inches long at any point, must be above the collar, and must be neatly styled. Spiked hair is not allowed.

IF IN DOUBT, DON'T WEAR IT.
